Mr. Tom Kline discussed the recent legislative update on bills that were signed into law by the Governor. A total of 43 bills were listed on the site. 18 bills were signed into law relating to Law Enforcement.

**AB 485**, Nguyen, hate crimes: reporting - require local law enforcement agencies to post the information sent to the department on their internet website monthly.

**AB 655**, Kalra. California Law Enforcement Accountability Reform Act

**AB 988**, Bauer-Kahan. Mental Health: 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline

**AB 1242**, Bauer- Kahan. Reproductive rights

**AB 1406**, Lackey. Law enforcement agency policies: carrying of equipment

**AB 1653**, Patterson. Property crimes: regional property crimes task force

**AB 1946**, Boerner Horvath. Electric bicycles: safety and training program - statewide safety and training programs based on evidence-based practices for

**AB 2043**, Jones-Sawyer. Bail bonds - prohibit a person from performing the activities of a bail fugitive recovery agent unless the person holds a license, as specified.

**AB 2229**, Luz Rivas. Peace officers: minimum standards: bias evaluation


